This NAMA Foray hosted by the North Eastern Mycological Foray has been named to honor Sam Ristich who has done more than anyone else to encourage mycological activity in this area. Sam not only pursues his passion for mushrooms with a stamina that leaves people half his age stopping for breath, but he inspires those around him to excel in areas he sees as their particular strengths. Sam has a knack for spotting rare birds, unusual mushrooms, good organizers, and superior students. He has helped nurture several of the

clubs in our area, and he has helped individuals develop an expertise in studying different kinds of fungi. If he sees that you show an interest in, say, polypores or slime molds, watch out! You're likely to be up to your gills in correspondence and specimens. If you are good with a microscope or show artistic talent, Sam will soon have you making exquisite photographs of spores or turning spore prints into artworks. Sam's teaching, like his slide shows, is not just instructional, it's inspirational. Sam can turn a casual interest in mushrooms into a life-long experience of discovery.

Out hunting mushrooms, it's Sam's voice that one hears in the woods, the shout to drop everything and come at once to see what has been found. It might be a strikingly beautiful mushroom, or an especially large fruiting, or, just as likely, some crusty old thing on a log, that you will soon want to know all about.

This guy from Aliquippa, Pennsylvania, who once worked in the steel mills and "jitterbugged like crazy," knows his warblers the way kids know different kinds of cars. He is a "bugman" (entomologist) by profession and a mycophile by temperament. Under his influence many of us have learned to open our eyes and ears, and get that rusty old brain of ours working again; and for that awakening, for that appreciation of the natural world, his friends now honor him at this foray.
